Addressing Vaccine Hesitancy

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Building Vaccine Confidence

There are many valid reasons individuals are hesitant to get vaccinated.

Before getting vaccinated, people have the right to have all their questions answered so they can feel confident they are making the best choice for themselves and/or their family.

Take the time to have meaningful conversations about vaccines, address concerns, and discuss the importance of all vaccines to our country.



Communication Tips



Acknowledge Concerns - People no matter their background, want to know they are understood. A simple "I understand your concerns" goes a long way to build trust and communication.



Personalize Approach - Statistics, scientific studies, and data are not as persuasive as personal stories. Sharing your expertise, experience, and empathy is a great way to build confidence in vaccines.



Make a Recommendation - Nobody should feel pressured or shamed into getting a vaccine. Simply share with patients/clients the recommendation to be vaccinated and support making a plan to do so.



Educate about Vaccines - The COVID-19 vaccine is not the only vaccine that keeps our country and state healthy. Take opportunities to discuss the importance of vaccines as a whole, not just COVID-19.



Consistency - Mixed messages create greater fear and hesitancy. To the extent possible, make certain everyone in your practice, school, or organization is sharing the same information from agreed upon and trusted resources.



Share Resources - Some people need to hear, read, and/or process information multiple times and in different ways. Provide resources for people to reference at a later date and share with their loved ones.



Healthcare and community professionals, no matter their specialty or training, are seen as leaders in rural and other minority communities. When discussing vaccines, being personal, positive, and consistent makes conversations more memorable and persuasive.



Communication Tips

- When possible, make messages personal. Include experience and/or local information when relevant.
- Keep messages positive. There are many reasons people may be vaccine hesitant. It is important to have these conversations in positive and respectful ways.
- If people have special medical concerns, suggest they at minimum have a conversation with their doctor or other healthcare provider to address those concerns in more detail.
- If there are local vaccination efforts, include the Day, Time, Location of the events along with the www.vaccinefinder.org website in case they don't see the post until after an event.
- Follow Tennessee Department of Health on your social media pages so that you can re-share/tweet new information and messages to your followers.

How often should you post?

We recommend picking three messages to share each month between now and the rest of the year. If
you have the opportunity to post more frequently, share personal and or local stories, and/or re-share
